**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER**

**WHEREAS**, the government has filed a motion pursuant to Local Rule 58.1 seeking approval of an amended schedule of collateral subject to forfeiture in relation to petty offenses and misdemeanors prosecuted by citation or violation notice from the Department of Homeland Security-Federal Protective Service, General Services Administration, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), and the U.S. Forest Service.

**AND WHEREAS**, the Court finds that the requested changes to the schedule for Federal Protective Service, General Administration Services, USFWS, and U.S. Forest Service offenses are in compliance with law and that no collateral amount exceeds the maximum fine authorized by law upon conviction for a listed violation.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that the motion of the government is **granted**. A schedule that includes these amendments shall supersede the current schedule in General Order 12-2. The clerk of court is directed to make this schedule available for public inspection at the courthouses in the Eastern District of Kentucky and electronically on the district court's web site.

**RE: LOCAL RULE OF COURT FOR THE FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL  
WITHOUT APPEARANCE FOR THOSE MISDEMEANORS DESIGNATED**

Pursuant to Rules 57 and 58 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, collateral may be posted in lieu of the appearance of the person charged by virtue of the Assimilated Crime Act, 18 U.S.C. Section 13, of certain misdemeanor and petty offenses under the applicable Federal Statute or Regulation, as hereafter set forth.

Upon posting the designated amount of collateral and upon the failure of the person charged to appear before a United States Magistrate for trial of the offenses listed in the following sections, collateral in the amount specified shall be forfeited to the United States and the posting of said collateral shall signify that the person charged did not contest the charge or request a hearing before a United States Magistrate. Forfeiting collateral shall be tantamount to a finding of guilty.

Forfeiture will not be permitted for those offenses designated by MCA (Mandatory Court Appearance), or when in the opinion of the arresting or citing officer the offense charged was aggravated by other circumstances resulting in the issuance of a citation for MCA, even when a collateral amount has been designated herein.

Nothing in this Rule shall prohibit a law enforcement officer from physically arresting the person for the commission of any offense, including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited, and requiring the person charged to appear before a United States Magistrate, or, upon arrest, immediately taking this person before a United States Magistrate, or other judicial officer.

Central Violations Bureau (CVB) shall establish and announce the procedures for the receipt of violation notices from issuing agencies and the receipt of collateral forfeited; the CVB shall refer to a Magistrate Judge for this District any violation notice requiring the appearance of the person cited, including mandatory appearances and any violation notice for which collateral has not been forfeited by the person charged after appropriate notice. The Magistrate Judge may use CVB system for management of his or her misdemeanor docket.

CVB shall provide the Magistrate Judge a docket of those cases referred to the court and shall notify each person charged, of the date and place of the hearing. A schedule of hearing dates is provided to the CVB by each United States Magistrate Judge yearly. The United States Attorney and the agency which issued the citation will be notified by the court of the date and place of the hearing. Hearings shall be conducted in accordance with Rule 58, Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure and other applicable federal regulations or statutes. The notice to appear shall advise the person of his right to appear as directed, or to forfeit the collateral as authorized by this Rule, prior to the time of his appearance; and the notice shall advise the person of the consequences if he fails to forfeit the collateral or fails to appear before the Magistrate when notified.

In the event the person failed to forfeit the collateral or fails to appear before the Magistrate when notified, then the Magistrate, upon a showing of probable cause, may issue notice, summons, or warrant directing such person to forfeit collateral double the amount otherwise established by this Rule. The notice, summons, or warrant shall advise such person of the consequences if he fails to forfeit collateral double the amount, or to appear as ordered. Upon motion of the attorney for the government, the Magistrate Judge may issue a warrant instead of a

summons.

If such person failed to forfeit the doubled collateral and failed to appear as summoned, the Magistrate Judge shall issue a warrant for the immediate arrest of such person and may assess any penalty which is provided by statute. Upon appearance, the Magistrate Judge shall proceed in accordance with Rule 5 of Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure and all other applicable federal regulations and statutes.

If doubling the amount of collateral which may be forfeited as provided above results in a collateral of more than the maximum fine established by the statute or regulation involved, then, in that event, the amount of collateral which may be forfeited is the maximum fine allowed by statute or regulation.

In the event a statute or code section as cited in this Rule is amended so as to change its section number, the catch phrase describing the offense as listed in this Rule shall control in determining the amount of collateral which may be forfeited or whether the person charged must appear.

**PETTY OFFENSES**

**Note:** Due to the increased liability and potential severity for environmental degradation posed by commercial and organized activities, collateral amounts for violations listed herein shall be doubled for corporations, businesses, partnerships, hunting clubs, and other organizations committing such violations, and for individuals committing such violations in the course of commercial activity.

All violations, unless otherwise noted, are Class B Misdemeanors.

**WILDLIFE/PROPERTY FORFEITURE ORDER**

Unless otherwise specifically ordered by a U.S. Court, any wildlife or property which has been seized under the authority of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, (16 USC 703-712); the National Wildlife Refuge Systems Administration Act, (16 USC 668dd-668ee), the Upper Mississippi River Wildlife and Fish Refuge Act, (16 USC 721-731), the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act, (16 USC 668- 668e), the Endangered Species Act, (16 USC 1531-1542), the Migratory Waterfowl Hunting and Conservation Stamp Act, (16 USC 718-718i), the Airborne Hunting Act, (16 USC 742j-1), the Rhinoceros and Tiger Conservation Act, (16 USC 5301-5306), the Marine Mammal Protection Act (16 USC 1361-1407), the Lacey Act, (18 USC 42), the Lacey Act Amendments of 1981, (16 USC 3371- 3378), the Wild Bird Conservation Act, (16 USC 4901-4916), or the Archaeological Resources Protection Act, (16 USC 470aa-4 70mm), where the final disposition of the case has been made by either payment of a forfeiture of collateral or a judgement by the Court on behalf of the government and where so authorized by statute, such wildlife, or property shall be forfeited to the U.S. government and disposed of by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the manner prescribed by Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 12.
